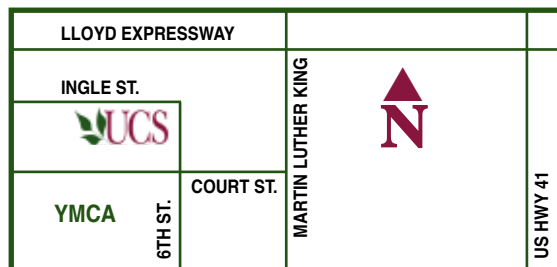

ANNUAL 2008 — 2009 REPORT

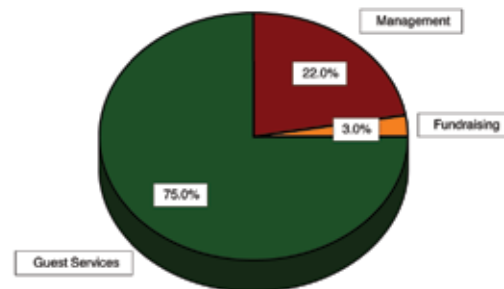

Annual Report of Services Provided in 2009

day shelter:

- 5,434 People came through our doors to find safety, comfort and shelter.
- 116,237 Hot meals were provided to the hungry
- 5,806 Loads of laundry by those who are homeless or near homeless
- 3,527 Showers were provided to those in need

night shelter:

- 339 Individuals had a safe, clean place to sleep for the night
- 23,064 Showers were provided for those without a home.

transitional housing:

- 28 Individuals participated in the Program
- 6 Individuals moved into permanent housing and independent living
- 4 Individuals completed the program
- 2 Individuals experienced severe health complications and died

services provided

- **A safe haven to eat and/or sleep**
- **Showers and Laundry facilities** (*only one in town*)
- **Three meals served daily**
- **Use of the shelter's address and phone number for job applications**
- **Counseling and Social fellowship**
- **Health Care, Mental Health, Employment and Social Service Referrals**
